we'd like to convince you to come to an extraordinarily interesting and instructive meeting: The Fourth Swiss Movement Disorders Symposium. This year's program was selected by an enlarged scientific committee, which welcomed for the first time the participation of Pierre Pollak from Geneva, Christian Baumann from Zürich and Stephan Bohlhalter from Lucerne.

We will kick off the event on Thursday evening with a delicious dinner that will be spiced up by a series of captivating videos. The next day, the talks will feature an array of important as well as unusual topics. After a break, we will have two more highlights for you: Emmanuel Roze will remind us that unusual disorders should not be forgotten (it takes a speaker with outstanding knowledge to tackle this subject!) and Christian Baumann will summarize what important findings have been published since our last meeting.
